SHADE SCHOOL

Overview

Shade School was officially opened in January of 2020 and welcomed thirty preschoolers to learn in one of our two classrooms: the baby class for two and three-year-olds and the middle class for four and five-year-olds. Experienced Shade teachers, Janeth and Debora, welcomed these children from our community to participate in an English-medium environment, where they are taught letters, numbers, communication skills, music, art, Bible, sports, health, and interpersonal skills.

Activities & Accomplishments Highlights

Baby Class	Tracing, matching, and coloring letters and numbers Singing songs and do activities about parts of the body, things in the environment, and how to clean your face and mouth	Identifying lowercase letters a-g Seventy percent of the class can consistently read, write, and count objects 1-7 Practical cleaning of the face and identification of items used for cleanliness

The vision of Shade is to provide children with a place of hope and holistic care, that nurtures the spirit, soul, and body. At Shade School, this looks like:

- Enriched porridge for breakfast and a healthy, afternoon snack (a fruit, vegetable, or protein)
- A school uniform, sweater, and track suit for sports
- Quality curriculum adapted from the Tanzanian and American resources
- Teaching of the Word of God through *The Gospel Project Preschool Curriculum*
- A positive, life-giving approach to instruction, focusing on positive reinforcement over negative consequences
- Teachers that love the Lord and the children above all curricular goals
